As we see so many affected by war, climate breakdown and spiralling living costs, we know how much the world needs Quaker values and witness. How can we, a steadfast radical faith community in Britain, equip ourselves and the world to face these challenges?



We believe that our thriving and diverse Quaker communities, locally and through our centrally managed work, can help the world in these troubled times. Inspired by the spirit in our meetings for worship, we can work to build a sustainable and peaceful world.

This year, we are proud of all that we have achieved in collaboration with Friends and Quaker communities throughout Britain.

- We have supported individual Friends in need and meetings, through our Hope Grants, Meeting House Grants and other funds
- Our Peace Education team launched three videos showing the impact of this work can have in schools. In 2023, we develop new peacebuilding work in communities in Britain suffering from physical and structural violence.
- We now have eleven Local Development Workers in place serving Quaker communities where they live and aim to have fourteen in place by the end of 2022.

But sustaining this Quaker work is a challenge. Quaker work needs Quakers' financial support

Some have more capacity to help than others, particularly as the cost of living spirals. If every member and attender gives according to their income and needs, we can support Quakers and deliver Quaker work to benefit the world for years to come.

Making the case for peace education

When given the opportunity, children and young people have shown they can be powerful peacemakers in their schools and beyond. We highlight examples of this to inspire wider engagement with peace education.



In 2022 we published *Peace at the heart*. Complemented by a series of videos showcasing peacebuilding in schools, this report by David Gee presents strong evidence for the positive difference peace education makes to schools and young people. Over 200 people joined the online launch of the report in May 2022, and it was featured on BBC Radio 4's Sunday programme. At the launch were teachers, policymakers, academics and civil society organisations from England, Scotland and Wales, while the videos have reached thousands more.

Welcoming children and families

“We have no children” is a statement we often hear from meetings. Our Youth, Children and Families team listens to Quaker communities to find out what they mean by this. Sometimes we hear that they don't hold a regular children's meeting, but that they wish to strengthen an intergenerational meeting.

Our staff support meetings to be ready for children and young people. We work together to create welcoming spaces, produce publicity and resources, and equip adults with the skills and confidence they need.

Our Youth, Children and Families team coordinates network meetings online so that Friends from across Britain can come together and connect. By hearing what has worked elsewhere – such as worshipping outdoors, at different times or in newly renovated rooms – Friends have been inspired to try new things in their own meetings. As a result, more meetings are ready to welcome children and families.

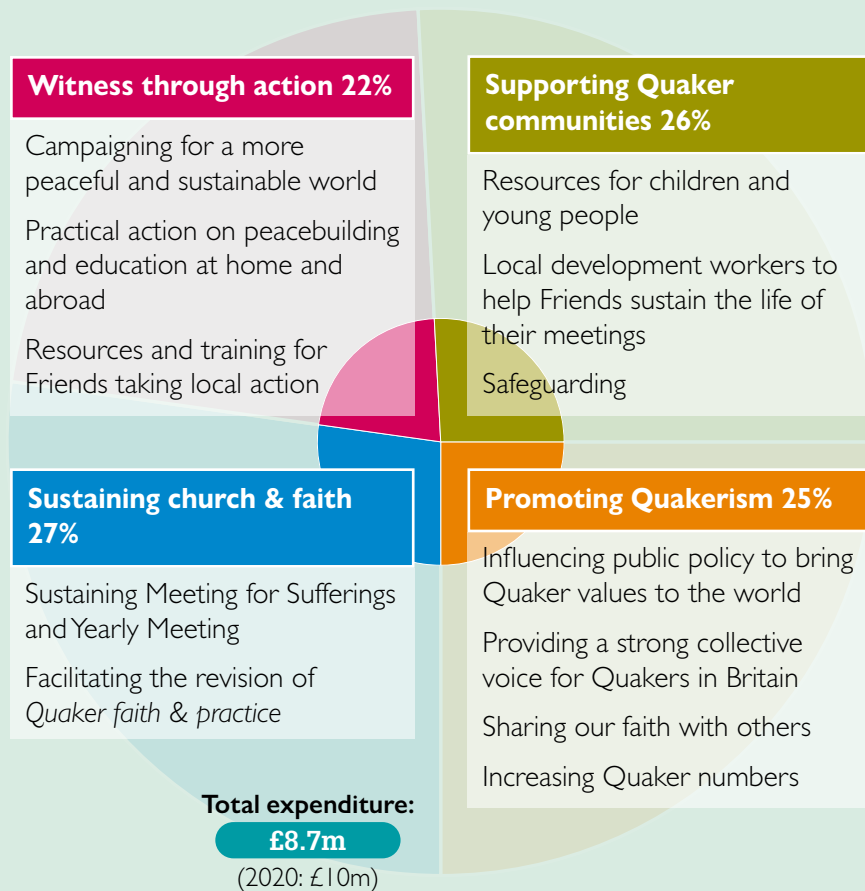
